Working with Indigenous people of Ga to revive culture and enact survivance, I draw on storytelling by briefly reclaiming ancient African rhetoric. I contend that storytelling does not need to illustrate core concepts only. Independently, storytelling could serve as a knowledge making praxis. Thus, by listening to the indigenous Ga of Ghana, I formed a relationship between Indigenous practices and the teaching of technical communication. Ga concepts drawn from visual rhetoric like the akpakpa (papaya) help us to think more of practicing collaboration: faculty working with faculty, students and faculty work together to think with and address community's problems through documentation and or applying the digital.
